
## The Supreme Court of Missouri Historical Society



## RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS**, the trustees of the Supreme Court of Missouri Historical Society note the passing of William H. Leedy, a former trustee of the Society, at the age of 92; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Leedy was a native of Kansas City, Missouri, the only child of Chief Justice C. A. Leedy and Agnes Hudson Leedy, and received his A.B. from Washington & Lee University, then an LL.B from the University of Missouri and an LL.M. from New York University; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Leedy served in the United States Air Force, as a JAG officer, during the Korean War, and thereafter practiced law with the Lathrop law firm in Kansas City, Missouri, for 44 years; and

**WHEREAS,** Mr. Leedy served as General Counsel and Secretary of the Federal Reserve Bank, on the Board of Police Commissioners, as a member of the Missouri Bar Board of Governors, as President of the M.U. Law School Alumni Association, and on the Missouri Appellate Judicial Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Leedy served in a number of professional and charitable entities, including as a Director and Secretary of the National Parks and Conservation Association and as a member of the vestry for Grace Episcopal Church; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Leedy will be remembered for his gracious presence, his courage and determination, and his deep devotion to his family and friends; and

**WHEREAS**, Mr. Leedy was predeceased by his wife of 63 years, and is survived by his two daughters and their families – Milly Leedy and her daughter Rosalie Armao, and Laura Leedy, and her two children Samuel and William Gansler;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that we, the trustees of the Supreme Court of Missouri Historical Society, join in extending our sincere appreciation to Mr. Leedy and his family for his outstanding service to the Society, to the citizens of Missouri, and to the administration of justice, and further extend our condolences to his family for their loss.
